### THE WORLD



How would you describe the worldview of Brad (also known as Lucky Chucky the radio shock jock)? Where do you think Brad got the idea that he should think like that? How does he live out that worldview, and what rewards does he reap?



Read Romans 1:18-25, 32



Why is suppressing the truth about God the first step toward embracing lies about the way the world is and how we ought to behave in it? If “worship” means “to stand in awe of” something, and if “serve” means “to obey,” when people reject God, what do they worship, and how do they serve it?

### REGRET



Clay describes himself as a Christian, so why isn't he more joyful? Why do you think the sins of his past: his college party lifestyle and his wronging of Kelly, continue to haunt him? How does holding on to past sins – turning them over and over in his mind – handicap his relationship with Amber?



Read 2 Corinthians 7:8-10



How do you think God regards our sins – how bad are they, really? Why is grief an appropriate response when we are confronted with our sins? Why do you think Paul says that “worldly grief” leads to “death”? Can you think of some examples? Why is “godly grief” different?

### BE DIFFERENT



Name four or more ways that Clay's behavior challenges how our culture encourages people to act. What kinds of virtues are behind each one of these counter-cultural choices? What does Clay risk in making these kinds of choices? What does he hope to gain as a result?



Read Romans 12:1-2



What are practical ways we make our bodies a living sacrifice to God? What kinds of cultural pressures do Christians, trying to do the right thing, face? How do Christians learn to think and act differently in obedience to God's will?

### FORGIVE



Clay's problems don't stem simply from his inability to let go of his past. How does Clay's self-righteousness lead him to believe a lie about Amber? Amber sees what she believes is a hypocritical act by Clay. How does she ultimately respond? What is the key difference between Clay's and Amber's views on forgiveness?



Read Matthew 18:21-35 and Ephesians 4:31-32



What does Jesus point to as the reason why His followers are to be marked by extravagant forgiveness? What are some attitudes that are “kindness killers” in us? What must we do to “put away” those attitudes? What are three easy ways to practice kindness to other people? What is a circumstance or a behavior that makes it hard to be kind or to forgive? How will you go about mastering it to develop a kind, forgiving heart?
